Notes to Map

- (1) The historical records identify ten towns where Mrs Chisholm set up emigrant depots to the end of 1842. They do not state whether her New England regional depot was in Tamworth or in Armidale. Both towns are shown with a black dot in the Map on page (1), making a total of twelve towns so shown.
- (2) The bush party journeys in the Map rely on the details in chapter II of Margaret Kiddle's Caroline Chisholm.
- (3) The scale of the Map is only a rough approximation.

The Eight Grazing Districts


For each of the grazing districts, William Baker's original Map included selected statistics from the Census undertaken in New South Wales in 1841. These document the small population, the large numbers of sheep and cattle, and the relatively small number of "stations" — separate grazing properties (called ranches in the USA). Indigenous persons were not counted in the Census.

Unfortunately, not all of the statistics are fully legible in the copy of the original Map, which is a reproduction from Baker's engraving. It even appears that some may have been altered by hand after printing. The following statistics should not be relied on for the purposes of historical study without first being verified. The most illegible of the statistics are assigned a question mark here. Another reason for caution is that Baker's population figures cannot be reconciled with the 1841 Census statistics published in James Waldersee's authoritative Catholic Society in New South Wales 1788-1860, Sydney University Press, Sydney, 1974, table 23.
